We are all excited to feel the warmth of the sun and see things slowly starting to turn green! Spring brings new life, and the desire to head outside to enjoy the fresh air without having to bundle up! Even though the temperatures are warming up, please continue to monitor weather reports, and make sure your child has appropriate outerwear for whatever the day may bring!! Having an extra sweater in the backpack can be a big help at this time of year on those days that the temperature drops rather than increases throughout the day!

This time of year also brings longer days, and the chance to enjoy extra hours of sunlight. This is a bit of a mixed blessing for our young children though, as we do see many tired children at school. These last two months of school are an important academic time, as the learning of the year is reviewed and solidified as we prepare students to move to the next grade. Please continue to be vigilant in making sure your child gets to bed early enough so they can get the proper amount of sleep which will allow them to function to their best ability.

This past month we were very busy working on plans for next year. One of the bigger tasks at this time of year is getting our staffing in place. With our continued growth, the Board of Trustees approved an additional 2.5 teaching positions for next year. We have chosen to add an additional resource teacher, a guidance/music/PE teacher, and a half time kindergarten teacher. The additional kindergarten teacher will allow us to have six classes of kindergarten this fall. We are very excited to be able to add another class as kindergarten involves so many new things; lowering class sizes at this level is extremely beneficial! We also have had to hire for four teachers who will not be teaching at HMK next year. Mrs. Smith (grade 4) is currently on maternity leave, and will be off all of next year. Mrs. Lazaruk is also currently on maternity leave, and has resigned her grade 1 position. Miss Taylor (also grade 1) has accepted a position in Crystal City which will be much closer to family for her. We are sorry to have two great grade 1 teachers leaving us, but wish each of them all the best in their new communities! The last teacher leaving is Mrs. Chapman (resource), who is going to be retiring at the end of the school year! Mrs., Chapman has had an amazing career, and helped countless children – and parents – in so many ways! We have a lot of great people who won't be back in the fall, but we have hired a great group of teachers to take over as we move forward! We have hired two resource teachers, Hylin McLaren and Denise Vebersax. Ms. McLaren is currently teaching grade 1 here at HMK, and has been teaching early years for over 20 years. Mrs. Vebersax is from Switzerland where she taught several years and specialized in working with higher needs children. To fill our two grade 1 positions, we have hired Ms. Colley and Ms. Dyck. Ms. Colley taught grade 1 at HMK in the fall, and is currently teaching grade 4 at HMK. Ms. Dyck is currently teaching grade 1 at HMK, and last year was one of our kindergarten teachers. We have hired Katrina Guillas as our new half time kindergarten teacher. Mrs. Guillas is currently teaching grade 2 and kindergarten at HMK, and last year taught grade 1 here. In grade 4 we have hired Claire Brister to fill Mrs. Smith's maternity leave. Ms. Brister is currently student teaching grade 4 at HMK, and will be graduating from Brandon University this spring. Our new guidance/music/phys ed teacher is Amanda Stewart. Mrs. Stewart has taught the last several years in Gladstone at the early and middle years level, and will bring a wealth of experience to this new combined role! We look forward to seeing all of our new teachers in action next year!!

## Bicycle Safety Reminder

We would like to remind everyone that bicycle riders under 18 years of age must wear a helmet and follow all of the rules of the road, including stopping at all stop signs. All bicycle riders need to stop at all stop signs, and should not proceed through any intersection until they have looked both ways and made sure it is safe to do so.

We would also like to remind all bicycle riders that bikes are **NOT** to be ridden on sidewalks. If a street is too busy to ride your bike, you should get off and walk it on the sidewalk, or find a road that has less traffic.

As far as children riding bikes to school goes, bikes are only to be ridden to school by students in grade 2 and up. Even though a number of students in kindergarten and grade 1 may be very good bike riders, only students in grade 2 or older are allowed to ride their bikes to school! The only exception to this is if a parent accompanies their child BOTH to and from school. We appreciate your understanding and cooperation in this.

## Bicycle Rodeo

We are pleased to once again be able to host a Bicycle Rodeo at HMK this spring. This year's Bicycle Rodeo will take place on May  $29^{\text{th}}$  and  $30^{\text{th}}$ , and will include all students in grades 1, 2, 3 and 4. The Bicycle Rodeo is sponsored and put on by Manitoba Public Insurance. A schedule will come out closer to the date letting you know which day your child will be participating. The Bicycle Rodeo teaches children all about bicycle safety, including safety equipment, and learning the rules of the road. There will be a bike course set up on the basketball court which will allow children to ride their bike on the course without being on the road. All children in grades 1 - 4 will participate, even if they do not yet know how to ride a bike! If they do not know how to ride, they will walk through the course, practicing obeying traffic signs, hand signals, and general safety protocols. The Bicycle Rodeo is such an excellent learning opportunity for all children – we are so thankful that MPI is coming to HMK again this year!


